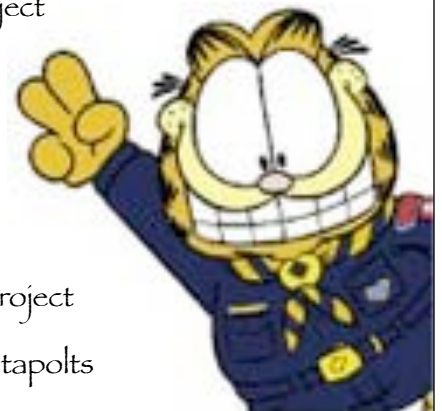

WE MEAN BUSINESS - PACK 567 WANTS OUR OWN TRACK!

Get ready for a Pack Penny Challenge!



You might be asking, what is a Penny Challenge?

It is a spirited game of friendly competition between the dens. The Scouts not only will have fun, they also will be raising money for the new Pack Pinewood Derby track.

Object of the game: each den collects as many pennies as possible during the "challenge" while simultaneously "sabotaging" the other dens. Of course, the ultimate object of the game is to give the Scouts an opportunity to raise money for their own Pinewood Derby Track.

Each den collects coins in a team container: The team container will be out during the den meetings in April and May (and the April Pack Night).

The Scouts bring "PENNIES" (pennies, paper/coin dollars, and even checks) to den meetings and put their "PENNIES" in the container that belongs to their team. Their team receives one point for every "PENNY" (or the value of the dollar or check) in the container.

BUT WAIT, IT GETS MORE INTERESTING... Scouts may sabotage the other dens by putting "SILVER" coins (nickels, dimes, and quarters) into the containers of the other teams. Each "SILVER" coin subtracts points from that container by the value of the coin. A nickel subtracts 5 points from the total, a dime reduces it by 10, and a quarter by 25! This is where strategy comes into play and this is why the game is so much fun.

Containers will be emptied and counted after each den meeting. The pennies and silver coins are counted separately. The total monetary amount of the silver coins is deducted from the total number of pennies. We will keep a chart of the team progress and post the results on the Pack website.

COME ON PACK 567, IT'S TIME FOR A TRACK "CHANGE"

...IT'S TIME FOR PACK 567 TO HAVE OUR OWN PINEWOOD DERBY TRACK TO RACE OUR CARS ON!

The winning den will be the first Scouts to run their Pinewood Derby cars down the new track! Once the track is ordered and delivered we will have a *non-competitive* Pinewood Derby Race and christen our new track. The winning Scouts will also be treated to ice cream sundaes to celebrate!

Our 2009 Pinewood Derby raised \$1100 for our new track, Congratulations Pack 567! We still need \$600 to buy our track though...we are so close.

It's time to get excited, get involved, and make this an exciting competition...in the end, everyone wins! So, bring your "PENNIES" for your team and your "SILVER" to sabotage the other dens.

The Skipper says...

Everybody Ready?

In the spring and fall we change our clocks. Now I know you did that, otherwise you would be late for school, but did you also check your emergency preparedness kit? If you don't have one, right now is the perfect time to make one - you never know when you will need it.

Let's get started...



1. Plan what disaster(s) are likely to occur in your area - Floods? Hurricanes? Earthquakes? Tornadoes?
2. Plan how your family will respond in an emergency - where will you go in a tornado? Where will you meet if there is a fire?
3. Plan what your family would do in a situation where you are evacuated. You may need to leave in only minutes. Have items in your kit that are ready for this. Don't forget your pets.

Now you have a plan, let's put a kit together. Here are some things to remember...

- Prepare for at least 3 days without power or water. A family of 4 would need at least 12 gallons of water (and add 1 extra gallon for each pet). Replace with fresh water when you change your clocks.
- Include extra clothes in your kit for each member of the family. These should be changed out when you change your clocks.

- Canned goods keep longer, be sure you have enough for everyone for 3 days. Don't forget the can opener and if they are foods that you need to cook, remember to include a camp stove and fuel. Don't forget a bag of food for your pets too!
- Parents should include photo copies of important papers like insurance cards, bank information, ID's and credit cards.
- Be sure to include a first aid kit, flashlights, blankets, rope, duct tape, candles, a weather radio, matches, and batteries.

For a complete list of what to include in your kit go to www.scouting.org

If you have a kit already, you should check it each time you change your clocks. Make sure that nothing has expired, if it has, write it down and replace it right away.

If you have a dog, make sure that your kit includes records of vaccines, a leash, an extra collar, food and water and food and water bowls. For a cat, be sure to have a leash, pet carrier, records of vaccines, an extra collar, food and water, food and water bowls, cat litter, a small litter box, and a cat carrier. For small animals have food and water, food and water bowls, a carrier, and anything else they would need. Don't forget to include a pet specific first aid kit.

Please bring comfortable hiking shoes to enjoy the hike and a camera to record your memories.

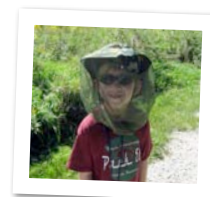

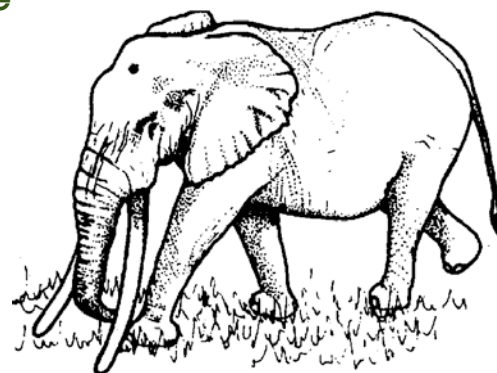
